What is a Title I School?

Title I is the largest federally funded education program in the United States.

Title I provides supplemental funds to assist eligible schools with meeting their educational goals.

Schools are identified by the percentage of students who qualify for the *Free and Reduced Lunch* program – currently 61% at Dowell.

Dowell has received school-wide Title I funding since SY12.



How does Dowell use the Title I funds?

Total Budget - \$343,140

Academic Coach, Parent Facilitator, part-time tutors - \$206,013

Staff Development - \$6,600

Family and Community Engagement – \$4,406

Instructional Resources and Supplies –\$130,527



How does Dowell participate in the Title I program?
